2017 INNOVATION AWARD

In the private subsidized college network, tradition and innovation go hand in hand. While maintaining the excellence and rigour that characterize them, institutions demonstrate creativity and innovation to meet the diversified needs of their increasingly heterogeneous student populations.

Consequently, innovation is at the centre of the mission of subsidized private colleges. There are numerous examples: Introduction of the International Baccalaureate; development of new programs in new areas such as fashion and circus arts; implementation of the co-op program; the development of programs focused on developing the workforce, and internationalization policies and practices, etc.

The Innovation Award of the Association des collèges privés du Québec (ACPQ) recognizes the innovative achievements of one or more member colleges of the ACPQ that have undeniable positive benefits for the quality of training, academic success, administrative or pedagogical management, respect for the environment, recruitment, a region's economy, and the reputation of private education. Achievements come in various forms. These include a different pedagogical approach, a new program, an important partnership, research from a new angle, a management initiative, and an institutional innovation, to name only these.

Award Ceremony

The ACPQ presents the Innovation Award annually, usually at its thematic day at the end of the year.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the achievements of ACPQ member colleges must have been attained within three years prior to the date the Award nomination is submitted.

To qualify, the project submitted for the award must be accompanied by the Award Nomination Form duly signed by the nominating person or people and by the academic dean.

The achievements are submitted by ACPQ member colleges following a call for nominations.



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Jury

Nominations are evaluated by a jury of partners from private colleges, appointed by the director general of the Association.

The jury makes recommendations to the Executive Committee of the Academic Deans Commission, which determines the Award winner.

Selection Criteria

- Nature of the achievement (topic; objectives; procedure, and results)
- Originality
- Transferability
- Dissemination

Deadline for submission of applications: March 17th 2017
